# Jed's steward update:

• 6 active grievances, 5 at DNR, 1 at DLI. Just filed two more last week as a result of communication study results.

Jed's **DNR Meet and confer** update (last meeting 10/23 meeting):

Vacation accrual credits – Some people have received updates from HR saying requests have been
receive and processed. First note is confirmation that you had a valid appeal and we'll give you
something, and your info is sent to transactions team who will put it into self-service. Not sure about

notification at that point. They have been making progress, but unclear when everyone will be notified and processed. No clear appeal process. Only need to be under 275 hours at some point in the year, so shouldn't be too big an issue if people get a big influx of hours.

- RFP for new lease for DNR Central Office; is for less space.
- Fisheries Had separate meeting 12/9 with management. Got some answers, more questions. Also talked about ongoing naturalist safety concerns in state parks.
- Communications study results from appeals haven't been released yet, 20 put in and only two changed. Looking to meet w/assistant HR director about the great frustration staff are feeling, any additional steps w/DNR (unlikely), so move to MMB and then to governor's office. Because lots of decisions don't make sense as compared to other divisions.
- Idea of a feedback loop is still under discussion.



• Leadership team met to discuss. Budget looks similar to current year, but propose increased membership growth activities to get more people involved. Concern expressed from a member about conservative use of local MAPE budget because of concerns in costs of dues. Claudia highlighted some of the things that dues pay for (including Negotiations), and explained the progressive dues rates (75% of one hour of time per pay period). Monica highlighted the difficulties in getting new hires to sign up because of virtual new member orientation and virtual work. Leah Shepherd (incoming membership chair) is designing new plan for one-on-one meetups with new hires - some budgeted membership money planned to go toward that.

#### Dan's Business agent update:

- Important to be engaged in our union, including dues structure. Organized money and organized people gives us our power. We are the largest independent union (meaning we don't have an international union, AFL-CIO), so we're not paying into an international organization (which is a lot for other unions). Every bit of our dues goes to MAPE, and is accountable to the board and committees.
- Lobby Day March 6, 2025. In the past we've often had ~300 people, this year we're looking to have 3000. Members meet with senators and reps, and we have a large rally to show we're strong, we care about agency budgets, recruitment and retention issues, etc. Calendar link
- Contract Action Team: You'll say I'll take ten people and get to know them and what they care about in the contract, and be in relationship with them throughout the bargaining into June.

### Claudia's **Board update**.

- Board has implemented some of the things that delegate assembly assigned it to do putting together a
  task force to look into divesting pension from human rights violations; statement written supporting a
  ceasefire in Palestine. Building corporation work investing money in building maintenance. Meeting
  scheduled in December.
- The Board loves to hear from members at member comments 5 min at every board meeting.

### Claudia's Coalition Building Work Group update:

Working with other unions to learn about their tactics, how they prep for things like strikes. This work
group is open to anyone, makes decision on where we provide solidarity for other unions on strike, share
opportunities to join people on a picket line. Been involved with <a href="Wee Make Minnesota - rally">Wee Make Minnesota - rally</a> at the Capitol
on Jan 29. Related to concerns about potential budget cuts to agencies - push for no tax cuts and
increasing taxes on wealthy and corporations. <a href="More info">More info</a> on 32 hour work week.



# Monica's MAPE Political Action Committee update:

 Wrap up gathering for the PAC last week. MN House is tied. Both of our MAPE members got reelected to legislature. Starting to plan for door-knocking for 2026 campaign. How to get more people involved. This work comes out of PAC fund (completely separate from dues).

• Negotiations committee - ramping up engagement with members.
