Section 3. Vacancies.

D. Vacancies in Statewide Offices. <u>1)</u> When the office of statewide President becomes vacant, the office shall be filled by automatic succession of the First Vice President, and the vacancy is then in the office of First Vice President.

<u>2)</u> When the position of statewide First Vice President, Second Vice President, Secretary, or Treasurer becomes vacant, and an election for that office is scheduled to be held within the same calendar year, the office shall be filled by a majority vote of the Board of Directors. Otherwise a special election shall be held to fill the vacancy.

<u>3)</u> If the office of statewide First Vice President becomes vacant, and until such time as an election or appointment by majority vote of the Board of Directors, the statewide Second Vice President shall perform the duties of the statewide First Vice President.

4) If the office of statewide Treasurer becomes vacant, and until such time as an election or appointment by majority vote of the Board of Directors, the statewide First Vice President or Second Vice President, in respective order, shall prepare and sign checks for such purposes as are required by the governing documents or are authorized by the Delegate Assembly, the Board of Directors, or the statewide President. 5) If the Speaker becomes vacant, the remaining meet and confer chairs shall fill the position by special election.

ARTICLE VIII ELECTIONS AND VACANCIES

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- D. Vacancies in Statewide Offices.
 - When the office of statewide President becomes vacant, the office shall be filled by automatic succession of the First Vice President, and the vacancy is then in the office of First Vice President.
 - 2) When the position of statewide First Vice President, Second Vice President, Secretary, or Treasurer becomes vacant, and an election for that office is scheduled to be held within the same calendar year, the office shall be filled by a majority vote of the Board of Directors. Otherwise a special election shall be held to fill the vacancy.
 - 3) If the office of statewide First Vice President becomes vacant, and until such time as an election or appointment by majority vote of the Board of Directors, the statewide Second Vice President shall perform the duties of the statewide First Vice President.
 - 4) If the office of statewide Treasurer becomes vacant, and until such time as an election or appointment by majority vote of the Board of Directors, the statewide First Vice President or Second Vice President, in respective order, shall prepare and sign checks for such purposes as are required by the governing documents or are authorized by the Delegate Assembly, the Board of Directors, or the statewide President.

- 3. The Speaker will remain vacant until the November 2018 Negotiations Convention.

• Former MAPE members who are no longer in government service may become MAPE associate members.

• Associate members who return to government service automatically lose their associate membership status. B. Benefits. Associate members:

• Shall receive MAPE publications.

May participate in Local meetings. • May serve as non-voting associate members on local, regional, and statewide committees (with the exception of the Statewide Elections Committee on which associate members who are retired may serve as a voting member), with expenses but not lost time - paid. (They will not be included in the required number of committee members with the exception of the Statewide Elections Committee on which associate members who are retired shall be included in the required number of committee members.)

• May attend the annual Delegate Assembly at their own expense, except MAPE will pay for breakfasts and lunches. However, associate members serving in volunteer positions at the Delegate Assembly such as teller, timer, etc., will have mileage and lodging paid for by MAPE.

• Shall have such other benefits as may be determined by the Board of Directors.

• Associate members have no voting rights in MAPE with the exception of the Statewide Elections Committee on which associate members who are retired may vote.

Section 1. Composition.

The Delegate Assembly shall consist of the members of the Board of Directors and the delegates elected by Locals. Each Local shall be allocated one Delegate for each 75 members (with no rounding up of fractions), with a minimum of one delegate, who shall be the Local President. Calculation of the number of delegates shall be done annually biennially by the Second Vice President, using data effective April 1. The Second Vice President shall be responsible for completing this calculation and for notifying Locals in writing of the number of delegate positions.

Each Local may also elect a ranked alternate delegates equal in number to the number of for each delegates allowed to that Local. Delegates and alternate delegates must be members of the Local they are elected to represent at the time of the Delegate Assembly or Special Delegate Assembly. In electing delegates, each Local shall endeavor to ensure that the overall delegation is balanced and representative of the entire Local. If a local president is unable to attend a Delegate Assembly, the vice president will take the president's place as a delegate. If the local has no vice president or the vice president cannot attend, the highest ranked alternate will become a delegate. If the president leaves the Delegate Assembly and the vice president is present, the vice president will take the president's place. If the president leaves the Delegate Assembly and the vice president is not present, the highest ranked alternate will become a delegate. Special Delegate Assemblies shall consist of those delegates and/or alternates eligible for seating at the last-held **Delegate Assembly (if they remain eligible**

If a local president is unable to attend a Delegate Assembly, the vice president will take the president's place as a delegate. If the local has no vice president or the vice president cannot attend, the highest ranked alternate will become a delegate. If the president leaves the Delegate Assembly and the vice president is present, the vice president will take the president's place. If the president leaves the Delegate Assembly and the vice president is not present, the highest ranked alternate will become a delegate.

Section <u>118</u>. Meet and Confer Committees.

There shall be a Meet and Confer Committee for a given Appointing Authority. The committee shall have a maximum of seven regular members and two alternate members plus a Business Agent and a Statewide Officer.

Alternate members will be considered regular members, with voting rights, when substituting for a regular member at a meeting.

More members may attend upon concurrence of the Statewide President and the Chair. The membership of the Meet and Confer Committees are subject to the approval of the Board of Directors.

The Meet and Confer Committee shall have a Chair and Vice Chair. The President shall appoint the Chair after consultation with the Executive Committee. The Chair shall appoint the Vice Chair with concurrence of the President.

Section 8. Meet and Confer Committees.

There shall be a Meet and Confer Committee for a given Appointing Authority. The committee shall have a maximum of seven regular members and two alternate members plus a Business Agent and a Statewide Officer.

Alternate members will be considered regular members, with voting rights, when substituting for a regular member at a meeting.

More members may attend upon concurrence of the Statewide President and the Chair. The membership of the Meet and Confer Committees are subject to the approval of the Board of Directors.

The Meet and Confer Committee shall have a Chair and Vice Chair. The President shall appoint the Chair after consultation with the Executive Committee. The Chair shall appoint the Vice Chair with concurrence of the President.

Section 12. Membership Committee.

The Second Vice President of MAPE shall chair the Membership committee. The Membership Committee shall consist of the Second Vice President and at least six additional members, appointed by the President. The committee shall also be responsible for establishing criteria for receiving MAPE scholarships and selecting MAPE member scholarship recipients.

Whereas, fewer than 6 members have requested paper ballots in recent elections; and

Whereas, members will have improved access to information about candidates if the information is published on the MAPE website; and

Whereas, candidates want and need to use social media in their campaigns; and

Whereas, the current Election Rules did not contemplate the use of social media (Facebook, twitter etc.) in MAPE campaigns and elections; and

Whereas, the current Election Rules, which require that local special elections be held only at a meeting, greatly limits the participation rate compared to electronic elections; and

Whereas, current Election Rules provisions allowing a choice between holding elections at a meeting or holding hybrid elections results in multiple sets of election rules and 3 different timelines, increasing confusion for members and voters, thereby reducing participation in the democratic process; and

Whereas, in post-election surveys, members have repeatedly and overwhelming favored electronic elections over any other type; and

Whereas, elections held at a meeting greatly limits the participation rate compared to electronic elections; and

Whereas, to make an informed choice, voters need and have repeatedly requested information regarding a candidate's priorities and goals and reasons for seeking a

particular office and that a personal statement provided by the candidate and made available with the ballot is the best way to provide this information; and

Whereas, requiring the same information from all candidates provides a consistent basis of information for voters and creates a level playing field for candidates; therefore

ELECTION RULES

Article IV Campaign Support

- **5. General Resources.** Candidates shall not accept support of money, facilities, paid labor, or other goods or services for the benefit of their campaign from any profit or non-profit corporation, unit of government, political action committee, or collective bargaining representative or an affiliate thereof.
- 6. MAPE Resources. Except as provided in these rules; the funds, staff, materials, equipment, and facilities of MAPE shall not be used with the purpose or clear effect of benefiting or harming any candidate's campaign. Candidates shall not solicit campaign contributions at MAPE's offices or during the official business portions of MAPE sponsored events.

7. Candidate Campaign:

- Candidates for any statewide election will submit a short description of their desire to serve.
- Candidates for any statewide election may submit a long description of their desire to serve; including a photograph.
- Candidates for any statewide election may create a YouTube or similar recording to be open for viewing.
- Candidates may attend local meetings as part of their campaign

At the discretion of the Appointing Authority, employees who are hired into State service from another public sector employer, including the United States Armed Forces, or from a private sector employer in a position directly related to the employee's current State position, and who were in a vacation eligible position with that employer may be granted length of service credit in an amount up to the length of time employed by the previous employer. Length of service credit shall be subject to the following conditions:		

 There must be evidence to establish that the employee was employed by another public sector employer or by a private sector employer in a position directly related to the employee's current State position within four (4) years of the date the State hired the employee, <u>waived for Veterans of United</u> <u>States Armed Forces</u>; current bargaining unit employees may request consideration for previous employment as described in this paragraph;
 The employee must have been in a vacation eligible position with the previous employer;

3. The employee must provide the necessary documentation demonstrating his/her previous vacation eligibility status;

4. The amount of the length of service credit granted is at the discretion of the Appointing Authority.

The only language change we propose is in bold and highlighted in yellow above. We believe this will finally provide our veterans the necessary ability to receive this very needed and deserved benefit. According to the U.S. Department of Labor the average per hour cost for Vacation to the employer is \$1.10 per hour in our region - see reference below. A small sacrifice for our state employed veterans.
