Resolved, that the Constitution be amended to add term limits for the Board of Directors, including Statewide Officers, to limit each office held to three (3) consecutive terms, a total of six, (6) years.

What is being amended? ARTICLE IV Structure

Board of Directors. The Board of Section 2. Directors shall be the highest legislative and policymaking body of MAPE, except when the Delegate Assembly is in session. The Board of Directors shall be composed of the Statewide Officers and Regional Directors elected by a vote of the members received by secret ballot. Members of the Board of Directors, including Statewide Officers, shall be limited to 3 consecutive terms in the same position. The Board of Directors shall possess all the legislative and policy-making authority of the Delegate Assembly except the power to amend the Constitution and the Election Rules. The Board of Directors shall have the authority to make binding interpretations of all official MAPE documents including, but not limited to, the governing documents. The composition and functions of the Board of Directors shall be as provided in the governing documents.

Resulting Language ARTICLE IV Structure

Section 2. **Board of Directors**. The Board of Directors shall be the highest legislative and policymaking body of MAPE, except when the Delegate Assembly is in session. The Board of Directors shall be composed of the Statewide Officers and Regional Directors elected by a vote of the members received by secret ballot. Members of the Board of Directors, including Statewide Officers, shall be limited to 3 consecutive terms in the same position. The Board of Directors shall possess all the legislative and policy-making authority of the Delegate Assembly except the power to amend the Constitution and the Election Rules. The Board of Directors shall have the authority to make binding interpretations of all official MAPE documents including, but not limited to, the governing documents. The composition and functions of the Board of Directors shall be as provided in the governing documents.

The Constitution and Rules Committee believes this resolution is ready for debate. However, we believe this change, if passed, should be made in Bylaws, Article VIII Elections and Vacancies, Section 2 E, B Statewide and Regional Elections.



- 9) not have voluntarily crossed a MAPE picket line in six years, or three contract cycles this can be appealed to the Board of Directors.

In addition, the President, with the consent of the Executive Committee, may appoint up to three atlarge members to the Committee and shall appoint one member of the Committee to serve as Chair of the Committee or two members to serve as co-chairs. The Statewide Negotiations Committee shall represent MAPE during negotiations with the employer. The three at-large members may be on a temporary basis. The Executive Committee, by a two-thirds vote, may select a substitute for any one of the at-large members on a need basis. All appointments are subject to approval by a majority vote of the Board of Directors.

The Constitution and Rules Committee believes this resolution is ready for debate. This resolution is tied to resolution 4. If resolution 4 is not passed, this resolution should not be considered.
